Self development training for a better future

In the GYCO trainings a strong focus is on preparing young people to develop their own business. In this newsletter we'd like to introduce further examples of successful participants of the entrepreneurship and self-development trainings:

These are a group of youths from Comboni Samaritan. Most of them are street children going through rehabilitations. We managed through our partnership to take them through self development trainings to have a changed mindset towards life.

As a result of the self development training, most of them were able to change and accepted to go back to school. Most were enrolled in vocational skilling institutes from which they are receiving education under Comboni sponsorship. Others chose to do Entrepreneurship skills trainings in liquid soap production. They are in groups and make their own liquid soap and sell it to Comboni Samaritan.







Skills to develop the own business

This year most of the activities were in Self development training and Entrepreneurrship skills trainings. We trained different youths in the different villages within Gulu. We are glad that most of them formed groups where they collected resources and are currently involved in liquid soap production. They are selling the products and earning money.

This is a group of youths from Opwoyomal Village, Laroo division, Gulu city. This as the day they received training on liquid soap making.









This is the same group consisting of four individuals who teamed up and they are producing their own liquid soap.

International coaches worked with the GYCO team

In summer this year GYCO head coach Carmel Lee Paul has been part of the newly ICF (International Coaching Federation) certified team coaching Training by Erickson International as she is one of the first ICF certified Team coaches having taken part in the ICF team coaching pilot of 2022.

Part of the certification process for applying team coaches with ICF for applying team coaches is to present at least five team coaching experiences of which one or two can be pro bono.

Carmel Lee decided to offer to her colleagues to do some pro bono team coaching with the GYCO teams with the result:

Our team coach Carlo was very supportive in enabling the team think outside the box and have confidence that it is possible. I recommend more of these sessions to the team members in order to keep consistent in our activities."

GYCO's first farm crop production

As a result of the donations from "District 1910 Grant under the leadership of RC Vienna Albertina", we wrote a proposal on food crop production. At the beginning of the year, we planned and planted cassava, the local variety which takes one year to mature. The cassava will be sold, and the earnings will be used to support our own organization activities. In the near future, we shall have a youth Agricultural hub where many will learn farm skills and be empowered.

This is our farm journey from February till October:

The cassava plants are six-month-old and will be ready for harvest in the month of April 2024.

Before we could plough, this was how the farmland looked. We started by removing tree stamps.


Great support for GYCO in Switzerland

GYCO Girls' Soccer club could finish the league thanks to a great donation

The GYCO Girls´Soccer Club had their debut season in FUFA Women Elite League which ended in June 2023. The club finished 4th on the table of eleven Clubs. But only the the top two clubs on the table get qualified for the top tier of women football in Uganda which is the FUFA women Super League. "We then took time to prepare during the off season to wait for the start of season 2023/2024 which kicked off in Sep 2023. However, our resource mobilization efforts were not very fruitful at the start of the season which nearly prompted us to withdraw from the League prematurely before end of the first round due to lack of finances for covering the costs involved in having the games both home and away", so Edward Otika, CEO of the GGSC. The GGSC embarked on searching for financial supporters to be able to complete the season.

Luckily the Club received a donation from Günter Penzenauer who willingly donated € 1.300 which will be enable the girls finish the first round of the league successfully. It will also be remembered that this not the first time Mr. Günter Penzenauer is donating to the Soccer Club. In our debut season, he sent sets of jerseys and financial support which we will forever be indebted for. "As GYCO Girls'Soccer Club, we send our sincere gratitude to Günter Penzenauer for generous donation and call upon other willing donators to a brick on this so as to enable the girls shine in their unique talent of soccer", so Edward Otika.
